Make your voice heard

- ✓ Vote in local elections

Voting can bring real change. Register to vote and learn about candidates and where they stand on the issues you care about. Visit lwnyc.org/vote

- ✓ Call 311

311 is how the city tracks complaints and prioritizes issues. If something's bothering you, keep calling!

- ✓ Contact City officials

The more people who speak out about an issue, the more elected officials pay attention and take action. Find who represents you at mygovnyc.org

- ✓ Testify at public meetings

City Council and City agencies like the Rent Guidelines Board and the MTA hold public meetings to hear community feedback. Find each city agency's meeting schedule at nyc.gov/nyc-resources/agencies.page.



Take action

- ✓ Sign petitions

Lots of signatures will get your elected officials' attention!

- ✓ Volunteer your time

Even an hour a week can make a big difference.

- ✓ Go to rallies, marches, and protests

Join these events to help gain more attention for your issue.

- ✓ Run for local office

Run for a local position on your school board, community board, or even city council!
